Those who are not convinced can research it online. There are other theories of these story's origins, but be very careful about your conclusion. Those pushing alternate explanations won't be present to argue your case when you stand before God one day.

The same Bible that describes the flood also foretells a similar event yet to come, a final judgment upon this planet but not by water. That will be when Jesus Christ returns in the sky with great power and glory. The good news is God wants you to escape to his new earth. Jesus and his apostles tell us in the Bible how to "get on the Ark". This is coming. God has already done it once, the memory of which is embedded throughout the human race.

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# Mankind's Ancient Memories



Many ethnic groups around the world have ancient flood legends, where all living things drown in a deluge, except for a few survivors who repopulate the world. These stories have been found in literally hundreds of diverse people groups, in every inhabited continent. Most were passed on orally, and they changed somewhat over the centuries. However, many still share a number of common details.

Are these independently created myths? Or are they the faded memory of a real, and unforgettable, event - the common memory of all mankind?

The existence of these legends is not in question, being fully accepted by secular and religious historians alike. The only disagreement is over their origins.

Common details include: The flood was a divine judgement on mankind's sin, one or a few were forewarned and survived in a boat, animals were also on the boat, the flood and its destruction was universal, after the deluge the boat landed on a mountain and then a bird was sent out.

Many of these cultures were completely isolated from each other until 500 years ago, ruling out the sharing of their flood legends. Is it likely that such similar stories arose independently hundreds of times in all corners of the world? There are

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all corners of the world? There are no comparable widespread stories of worldwide destruction by fire,

earthquakes or meteors. The only feasible explanation is a single story when men were all together, before they spread around the earth. And hundreds of cultures agreed it was a story never to be forgotten.

This is just what the Bible's book of Genesis records: all men were together right after the flood, after which they dispersed around the globe. The Bible's version of Noah's flood was put in writing millennia ago and was preserved by the Jews. It doesn't have the magical, bedtime tale, style of the other flood legends, whose oral transmission corrupted them as we'd expect. Yet, many retain enough of the original story to prove a common source. They independently confirm the Bible. People groups all over the world remember, however imperfectly, a global flood as judgment from God.

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But if the race is always on, why in our day do we only ever see the finish? Missing links should be walking among us now, not just in the fossil record.

Try writing the detailed steps from no eyelid to a useful one. You'll make monsters. No one ever attempts this exercise. They simply assume there will only be finished products.

In fact, accumulated mutations *never* construct functional biological systems from scratch. No one has ever witnessed this. Mutations only make minor changes in existing designs like color, length and size, or they alter the ability of an existing system. This is all that science sees today.

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### Toenails Everywhere

Evolution teaches that random mutations in the genetic code create the components for new body



parts. Complete designs, like a digestive system, are formed by many small steps over a large number of generations. Those with better designs reproduce more. During this long process there would be hundreds, perhaps thousands, of intermediate designs, good and bad. Random mutations are mindless, so the creation chronicle has no beginning nor end. These blind architects

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Consider adding claws, or toenails (TN), to an animal. Blundering mutations will construct: TN on kneecaps, noses or tongues; TN made of muscle, hair, skin or fat; TN growing too fast, too slow, inward, outward or not at all. There will be hundreds of versions during this lengthy process. Natural selection must have options to choose between. Eventually TN on feet have an advantage, but only after a long history of half-baked tries.

Now add in everything else: teeth, skin, glands and joints; circulatory, nervous and reproductive systems; a long list. For each one, many unique partial designs (most of them ridiculous) must exist over many generations. This gradual, multi-step, process is the only way complex systems can be created from chance

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Evolution never stops, so we ought to see this today, humans with TN all over, and of different tissue. We should have partially designed ears, ribs, livers and brains throughout our body. We should look like monsters, many types. But we never see this in humans, plants or animals - only finished products. Nothing is in process.

Perhaps natural selection has eliminated the partial designs? The project takes umpteen generations. How can it be *only* in the past, and that for every biological system? Is evolution paused? A simpler respiratory system in another species is not a partial design, one step away. It's complete, an island separated from the more complex designs by miles of ocean, without a single stepping stone in between. Or maybe the process goes too slowly to be seen?

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contradictory beliefs is not a problem. Society largely ignores the issue, yet blindly expects most will reach land and "rest in peace". Most of our conflicting views cannot be legitimate. Can such a dysfunctional situation end well?

Wake up and face this question with the gravity it deserves, even if those around you continue to slumber. Those who've earnestly probed the subject of the afterlife have discovered that the truth is not hard to find. The problem is not lack of light or proof. The obstacles are carelessness, distractions, apathy, your loves and your hates. Your ship's provisions won't last. Arise, search for land, then head for it as if your life depends on it - because it does.

The captain, officers and sailors occupied themselves with their daily duties and preferred amusements, but astonishingly they gave little thought to reaching land. Furthermore, each man had a different opinion about reaching land, as to its direction, nearness and how to get there. 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Most astonishing was how the men did not feel in danger of starvation, but contently drifted on the ocean. Each clung to what "land" meant to them,

This is our society's attitude toward what lies beyond the grave. One man believes all will go to heaven, another says most, while another insists it will only be a few. This one thinks there is no afterlife, that one says we can't know, and a third doesn't care. Many expect not paradise but a recycling with reincarnation. Some claim only an echo of us survives death, others believe we dissolve and are absorbed into God.

narrow. This man holds only his version as authentic, another counters that all paths lead to God (even paths which say there is no god). How few ever examine whether the religion they were born into is credible.

Many presume they can mix divergent versions according to their own recipe. Some are uncomfortable with the topic, others say keep it out of public discussion, but the rare one preaches it from the rooftops. Still others regard the whole matter as unimportant, neglecting their future. Then there are those who insist it's unkind to accuse any of these diverse positions of being misguided. Lastly are those who profess a faith but refuse to practice what it requires.

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In the past, God would use pagan Gentiles as a rod to punish those Jews who strayed. Then, God would punish those same Gentiles for their own wickedness. Now, in love, Jew and Gentile are being reminded of those past judgments, to spur them on to turn to God, so that they may enter his promised paradise.

Don't make the mistake of those who cover their ears from God's warnings. They mock the very idea of a wrathful God. They rage at God's messengers, who were sent for their rescue. God's judgment has been plainly displayed, so you will have no excuse when one day you stand before your Creator. Make peace with him now through his Son. Otherwise, the same wrath tasted by the Jews will fall on you.

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### The Wrath of God



It is commonly

known that the Jews have been severely afflicted over the past 2000 years, underscored by the Holocaust. What is not commonly known is that Moses predicted this over 3000 years ago. Moses also gave the reason – God's wrath on his wayward children who would someday forsake him.

In the Bible read Leviticus ch 26 and Deuteronomy ch 28, where Moses forecast their exile to foreign nations, in order to be oppressed by their enemies. All the Jewish

The fulfillments were many, witnessed by thousands, and spread over two millennium right up until our day.

See how the God of the Jews has scattered a message for us across the history of the world. We know it's God's message, because he announced well beforehand what he would do - and why. It's the message of his wrath on whoever rebels against him.

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The Jews were privileged to know about God first, so those Jews who spurned him were punished first, while other Jews throughout history have obeyed their God.

The Jewish Messiah, Jesus, told us there will be a similar final accounting for both Jew and Gentile. History shows that the promises and warnings which the God of Abraham gives through his messengers are not to be ignored.

Since God has warned us by the lesson of the history of the Jews, what should you do? Turn from your evil ways and submit to him, whether you are a Jew or a Gentile. God takes no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but says, "Repent and live!" Seek God now while you still can, through the Savior he appointed for us, Jesus Christ.

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If you've been captive to a false prophet, you'll have to fight through these, but it can be done and many have.

Jesus said we'll know false prophets by their fruit, their words and deeds. Most of what they say and do will be okay, but mixed in you'll see things that are clearly out of bounds. Watch for this rotten fruit.

False prophets come in all shades, from those who boldly break from the biblical faith to those who unknowingly slip in a few false doctrines. Be aware that your favorite Bible teacher may fall somewhere in that spectrum, if they deviate from the original message. Let Moses, David and Isaiah; Jesus, Peter and Paul be your teachers and you can't go wrong.

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## False Prophets

"Many false prophets will appear and deceive many. They come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ferocious wolves." Jesus

Most would agree with Jesus, that false prophets exist. Our first response should always be to ask ourselves, "Could I possibly be following a false prophet?" It takes courage and humility to say, "Maybe I've been wrong all these years." It can't hurt to consider it. It's not doubt; it's being careful. If you think it fundamentally impossible for you to ever be wrong on this topic, then there's no benefit in you reading any further.

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For two thousand years, from Abraham to the apostle Paul, dozens of Jewish biblical prophets described their encounters with God. The Jews wrote it down as it happened. In every case, their portrayal of God's nature and message agree.

Centuries later a man arises saying, "I am a prophet of God like them, but my message skews in a new direction and supersedes theirs. I know what happened back then in Israel far better than those who witnessed it firsthand and recorded it. Trust me instead of the Bible (although there's no evidence of large-scale changes to the Bible.)" Common sense screams for us not to be taken in by such an obvious con man.



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These false prophets almost always stand alone and disagree with each other, completely unlike the biblical prophets who reinforced each other's words. Who are you going to trust? Will it be the large group of men who were eyewitnesses of God walking and speaking among the ancient Jews? Or will you pick one of the lone prophets who was not there, and who tells us to ignore all the others and trust him alone.

Throughout history many false teachers have splintered off from Christianity. Most attracted only small followings. A few have believers in the millions, and one has over a billion.

Why are so many led astray, as Jesus predicted? People are deceived by the same defects that cause all of mankind's ills: pride, stubbornness, apathy, greed, hatred, foolishness, evil desires, selfish ambition, delusions, etc.

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But no one bothers to do this due to laziness or they're sure they are right. A creature without lungs steps behind the curtain of millions of years and miraculously steps out the other side with lungs. No one ever explains what happens behind the curtain.

Consider the many steps in how babies are created. We can't wait the thousands of generations that randomness plus natural selection requires to redesign this system from a simpler animal's. It must be completed in *one* generation, or the new species perishes. All of our critical organs must work on the first try, or we're dead.

Consider that you may be an idol worshiper who believes that mud plus chaos plus time created all living things.

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### The Idol Of Chaos

Throughout the history of mankind, many cultures have invented and believed in idols. A statute is fashioned which is thought to have special powers over nature. Its devotees are convinced of these powers because certain events are wildly misinterpreted as proof. Once the belief is ingrained in a society, bias takes over and is very hard to dislodge. Sceptics are ridiculed.

In truth, the statue is a dead piece of stone which can't see, hear or walk. Yet, everyday events are assumed to be under its control, and are even interpreted as proof of its powers.

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Idols exist today, even in western culture. If not, then in what year did we magically break free of mankind's propensity to deceive itself? Is our culture too arrogant to see the idol we've invented?

Many are convinced that chaos plus millions of years has special powers over nature, a power that created every living thing. This presumed power, this idol, is called evolution. Museums are its temples preaching its message. Scientists are its priests and prophets, imploring that we can trust them. Sceptics are ridiculed.

In truth, this lifeless idol has no powers. Chance and disorder never create anything, no matter how many years you give it. The

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Some point to an animal's lengthening limb or color change. This is literally one step out of the million needed, and a trivial one. If an infant sketched a rectangle, would this prove that he could design the rectangular smart phone in your pocket?

If evolution really worked as believed, all living things would have partially designed stomachs, brains and kneecaps all over their body. You'd realize this if you spent a few minutes thinking how the process might work in detail.

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Watch out for assuming that you already know what the answers will be. The biggest challenge will be purging your mind of all the doctrines you've heard all your life. You want to start with a blank slate.

Once you finish this neutral sampling of the Bible, summarize your notes down to one page or less. Almost certainly you will find that your conclusions differ from what you thought was the gospel, so you will be glad you did this exercise. Of course, it's not enough to understand the map, you must walk on its trail to reach the treasure. Most people never get around to searching for the true gospel in this way. Do not put it off because of laziness or distractions. You do not want to be wrong on this topic!

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


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

Apply these principles: Approach each passage with zero bias, just as if you had never heard a speck of any Christian doctrine.

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Apply these principles: Approach each passage with zero bias, just as if you had never heard a speck of any Christian doctrine.

Give each passage equal weight. Don't let a few verses dominate. Determine the passage's main point without being influenced by what other parts of the Bible say. This will prevent manmade doctrines from coloring your interpretation. For the rare section you can't understand, don't force it; move on.

We must assume that God speaks to us in the Bible using the same rules of communication that we use everyday with each other. If not, then what rules would we use? Therefore, apply these well known and common sense rules for things like how literal to take figurative language or being careful to not read too much into what is said. It helps that the main points are often repeated and given from different angles, making the heart of the message hard to miss.

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You might be thinking, "Why are you so eager to douse our fun? This rules out a big chunk of the Sunday comics, and a lot else. My life would be dreary if I couldn't chuckle over slander, strife, violence and a lot else that God hates because it ruins this world." If you haven't figured it out by now, this also bans all teasing. "What! How could I possibly enjoy time with my friends without making fun of them, snickering at their failures, and pretending that I despise them?"

God requires morally purity, and that always takes priority over having fun. When you choose fun over virtue, you provoke him. You may think, "Oh, he'll laugh it off, like I would.", but you are dead wrong.

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That's Not Funny



When a child makes an inappropriate joke, their parent says, "That's not funny." No one should joke about the Holocaust or child molesting. Most follow this, but they still allow humor that is a notch below in cleanliness. People's boundary for what is acceptable can be arbitrary, permitting lots of carnal jokes. By staying away from the worst, they may even claim that they practice clean comedy.

Do you laugh when people insult one another, ridicule a person's stupidity or someone falls on their backside? Is the joke based on a vice like cruelty, drunkenness or sexual debauchery?

Do you giggle for stories about death, theft, greed or bathroom functions? You might say, "I can't help it. It's funny." It's time to ponder why you find bad behavior and people's misfortunes so entertaining.

This pamphlet is targeted at those who seek to be "pure in heart" like Jesus taught. Those caring little for that virtue will scoff at this. Yes, there are many sins more serious than unclean comedy, but "pure" means free from all contamination.

The rule of thumb is this: never joke about behavior that is not morally acceptable when done in seriousness, no exceptions. Humor never sanctifies unethical conduct. You likely already do this. Perhaps you never joke about sexual topics. Extend that rule to everything that is foul in God's eyes.

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Unfortunately, many who profess Christian faith will laugh at off-color banter. Or do you alter your standards based on the audience? If so, you are a hypocrite who is more concerned with how you look to men than to God, who is always listening in. This is not just about the jokes that you tell, but also the ones you laugh at. When you so much as grin at a funny story centered around an impure deed, you tell everyone around you that it's not a big deal and even a little delightful.

Do you forget that Jesus had to die to deal with all depravities, both big and small? Or maybe you mistakenly presume that God's moral standards are as low as yours. Now, for those of you who are not Christian you probably don't care about all this, but God does, and he will still hold you accountable.

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Then why not believe all religions? First, the claims of many are of no relevance and can be ignored. Second, who and how many are their eyewitnesses, if you can even find one? The Bible contains a huge number of eyewitnesses. You're not being asked to believe the words of one crackpot, like with a cult. The biblical witnesses were spread over many centuries and locations, making it impossible that there was any collusion or conspiracy.

The claim that copies of the Bible sustained wholesale changes to its message is untrue. You can easily check this out by comparing old copies of the Bible with today's. Read the whole Bible and judge the eyewitness accounts for yourself. Millions have, and they concluded that it is true history.

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#### Eye Witnesses



Is this you? "I don't believe what the Bible says, so I'm not at all worried about its warnings." If your neighbors raise an alarm, is it wise to ignore their voices, unless you have a sound reason to do so?

Some will say their reason is that they don't trust anyone but themself, yet they don't actually live that way. None of us are omniscient, and most of the information we live by each day we learned from others. This is how society operates and it works well. We give criminals a life sentence based on eyewitnesses. Likewise, you will plan a vacation to Australia without ever having seen it.

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"Yes, I know that, but it's different with the Bible." No, it is not. A jury isn't allowed to arbitrarily pick which witnesses to believe. And don't be lazy and fall back on some empty Bible objection you once read.

"So, should I believe everything I'm told?" Of course not. For topics that matter, you have learned to sift truth from error. Now do the same with the Bible. Why bother? A lot of sincere Christians are shouting, "You should listen to this." That should count for something. If the Bible is true, you really don't want to ignore it! God is not giving each of us a personal interview in his throne room. If God choose to speak through a few dozen biblical prophets, why fight him?



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experience the supernatural as the Bible promises. Yes, you must filter out bogus claims and coincidences, which are the vast majority, but God expects you to do that, and it's doable. You may end up with only a few cases of undeniable miracles that corroborate the Bible, but they still count.

Some won't accept the Bible's miracle stories, arguing there's no evidence for miracles, but that is circular reasoning. Eyewitness testimony is valid evidence, and the Bible should not be judged by special rules. That is the main point of this pamphlet. Miracles are rare, like the Jewish Holocaust, but that alone cannot be a reason to disbelieve. Demanding an extraordinary level of evidence is putting your fingers in your ears. What matters is the evidence that we do have, not the evidence we don't.

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But because of his great love for us, he promised a new creation, one which will not be cursed. It will be the future home of those who have ended their rebellion against him.

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
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Cozy With Sin




The above histogram portrays mankind's acceptance of sin in their own behavior. On the left are the few given to unrestrained wickedness. Those on the right tolerate nothing less than 100% purity. Most people are quite comfortable living in the middle.

We'd never hold up a store but will cheat on our taxes. We punish children for lying, but won't fight our own vices since, "nobody's perfect". We expect our

spouse to be faithful, but lust at strangers because "I can't help it."

We're indignant over violent acts in the news, yet slander our neighbor because, "That's not nearly as bad." This is the usual flip flopping, double minded attitude toward sin.

This doesn't make any sense! Why is only the left side of the graph heinous? Why can sins on the left be stopped but not those on the right? The existence of criminals on the left does not make the middle acceptable. Is wrongdoing wrong, or isn't it?

Mankind has spent thousands of years getting cozy with a measure of evil. We figure we only have to abhor the more vile atrocities. For the rest we make excuses: It's too hard to stop, I'm not that bad, everybody's doing it, I need my vices to cope, I'd be mocked (even in church) if I tried to be perfect.

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This lax attitude toward depravity was long ago dragged into the Christian church by Jesus' enemy, the devil. For centuries theological arguments have been amassed for why the right side of the graph is unattainable and even to be avoided. Christian, do you intend to stand before God and explain away why you permitted immoral deeds in your life, saying out the other side of your mouth, "but I believed in everything you stand for."?

Christians protest, "We can't be blameless. God knows that, and he is totally okay with it." Men told you this. Go back and study the whole Bible, without any hint of preconceptions, and see if God actually said it. God is not okay with sin, and he is coming to judge the world (including those in the pews) because of men's corrupt morality.

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This same warning to distance ourselves from all evil is repeated throughout the entire Bible. For the sake of the eternal destination of your soul, and for those you love whom your example may sway, run from whatever smacks of "Babylon"; run with all your might.

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
